



# Frayer Chart

## Steps for Using the Frayer Chart:

1. Place the target word in the center of the chart.
2. List characteristics of the word/concept in the upper right box.
3. Write a student friendly definition in the upper left box.
4. Write examples in the lower left box. These are often examples from the students' lives to create personal connections.
5. Write non-examples in the lower right box. These help to avoid misconceptions.

<b>DEFINITION</b> If people are emancipated, they are freed from unpleasant or unfair social, political or legal restrictions.		<b>CHARACTERISTICS</b> freedom separation no one controlling you have power that you didn't have before	
<b>EXAMPLES</b> turning 18 US breaking from Britain leaving the military slaves gaining freedom after Civil War same sex marriage rights	<b>emancipation</b>	<b>NON-EXAMPLES</b> school contract military jail tyranny (North Korea) held against will/slavery/indentured servitude
