

# Setting SMART Goals

Directions: Work with a partner to determine if the goals listed meet the SMART goals criteria. Revise the goals to meet the criteria, as needed. Review the two examples and then get started.

**Example 1: Students will attend 90 percent or more of summer program days.**

Revised: A majority (80 percent) of registered students will attend 90 percent or more of summer program days, as measured by daily attendance records.

**Example 2: By the end of the summer program, students will increase their reading level.**

Revised: By the end of our summer program, 80 percent of regularly attending students will improve their reading by half a grade level, as measured by the pre- and post-program tests.
