


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Do you use Y4Y?

- Launched in 2011
- Funded by the U.S. Department of Education
- Provides free training and resources for 21st CCLC Centers, including:
 - Online learning
 - Virtual and in-person trainings
 - Quarterly webinars
 - Online resources including blog posts, tool kits, sample lessons and planning materials

Y4Y's Impact

 **93** in-person TA sessions

23 conference presentations 

82 virtual targeted TA sessions 

 **18** quarterly showcase webinars

The Y4Y Portal (<https://www.y4y.ed.gov>) supports the TA with online learning opportunities and contains:

- **12 e-learning courses**
- **6 Click & Go packages** (downloadable mini-lessons and materials covering important topics)
- Additional resources including **webinar archives, tools, blogs and discussion boards**

In the last 5 years:

- The number of registered users grew from 5,780 to **13,937**
- Monthly average site visits have increased from 2,373 to **4,288**
- Newsletter subscriptions doubled from 5,000 to **10,000**

Y4Y Technical Assistance



- **Virtual TA**
 - 60- to 90-minute online sessions on topics related to Y4Y courses
 - Designed to provide an overview of a topic for practitioners
- **In-Person TA**
 - Between 4 and 16 hours of instruction on one or more Y4Y topics
 - Provides a deep dive into topics to help programs meet their needs

Y4Y Online Learning

- Y4Y Courses
 - Between 5 and 10 hours of instruction
 - Full course – 10 hours covering all aspects of a topic
 - Companion course – 5 hours providing an overview of important areas of a topic
 - Designed using International Association for Continuing Education and Training (IACET) standards
 - Include resources that allow Project Directors to train their staff



Y4Y Online Learning

- Click & Go

- Take between 30-60 minutes
- Provide TA where and when you need it.
- Designed to help 21st CCLC leaders understand the primary components for planning, designing and implementing activities
- Each includes a mini-lesson, podcast(s) designed to expand knowledge, tools, resources and Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs).
